**Participants** will gain а better understanding of Dutch society, including what to expect in certain situations, which occasions are celebrated. is learn what (in)appropriate behaviour, and also find out more about practical issues. This knowledge is likely to be helpful in their daily lives so that they can understand people, situations and processes or systems more easily.
